The Gospel of Mark

Lesson 14: Mark 6:30-44

A crowd "follows" Jesus to the wilderness (vv. 30-34)

- The apostles return from their evangelistic mission and report to Jesus
- He wants to give them time to rest (and eat!)
- The crowd follows and ends up getting to the destination first
- Rather than being angry, Jesus is moved with compassion for them
 - Consequently, Jesus begins to teach them
- Differences in the accounts:
 - Matthew Seems to tie the move to John's beheading; Jesus heals
 - Luke near Bethsaida; Jesus heals and teaches
 - John Passover is soon (explains the green grass); they go to a mountain

Why do the gospel accounts differ?

Jesus feeds a multitude (vv. 35-44)

- The crowd is bigger than the towns in the area
 - Procuring enough food for them would prove to be very difficult
- The disciples are a little snarky when Jesus tells them to feed the crowd
 - 200 denarii would be about eight months pay for a day laborer
 - John explains that Jesus is testing Philip (John 6:6)

What test would Jesus be presenting to Philip?

- Jesus assumes that there are some loaves of bread available (v.38)
 - Only John attributes these to a young boy
 - He also notes that these are barley loaves, which are small and flat

What might motivate Jesus to seat the people in orderly groups?

What do you notice about what was left over after everyone was fed?

- John alone notes the reaction of the people after the miracle
 - They connect Jesus with the Prophet (Deut. 18:15-19 recall last week)
 - Jesus does not want them to try and make Him king, so he withdraws

Why do you think all four gospel writers included this miracle?
