DISCOVERY-Let's read the passages- Text- 2 Peter (1-2)3-11

Consider these passages and their applications:

2 Peter 1:1-To those who through the righteousness of our **God and Savior** Jesus Christ have received a faith as precious as ours...

Peter is not mentioning 2 entities. He is pairing God and Savior as one here.**

Although Peter will address false teachers/false teaching, he is likely under Roman house arrest awaiting his execution-AD64-68. His Jesus devotion has not waned.

2 Peter 1:2-Grace and peace be yours in abundance...

His greeting reflects Jesus' own greeting (to His disciples) and understanding of what Jesus has done for him and all believers Peter emphasizes the Believer's "running over" blessing that comes with intimately knowing Jesus. "Greek word (epignosis) means "precise and correct knowledge."

2 Peter 1:3-His divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness...

This statement recognizes that the supernatural is key for Believers' success.

And this super nature of Jesus is ALL the Believer needs for good Yahweh worship, moral excellence and virtue. This doesn't mean that Believers should be perfect but the roadmap is Jesus and publicly/obviously owning the exchange of His perfect life for us is the "secret sauce."

2 Peter 1:4-Through these, he has given us His very great and precious promises...

The end of this verse is an acknowledgement that the planet's immorality and corruption is a lure to Believers. Although "born again" and "new creatures", there is a developmental roadmap/strategy to reinforce our Jesus identity. And these are promises made to Believers, not the nation of Israel in the OT. (Reference Matthew 5/6 and John 14 and John's book.)

2 Peter 1:5-6-For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith...

Jesus did all the work, completed it all and paid it all; Peter understands this. However, he is emphasizing the importance of human will in the attempt to regularly honor Jesus' sacrifice.

- Even if the gift is free, you still have to raise your hand to accept it, have to pick it up, have to claim it, have to pay the taxes on it, have to own it.
- ✓ Now, Peter begins the building blocks of genuine Believership.
- ✓ It's not ok to remain a gift claimer/possessor only

2 Peter 1:6-7-and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance...

Peter echoes similar teaching by Paul. Living a Jesus-honoring life is like dedication to becoming a superior athlete.

- ✓ Continue to work out your salvation-(Phil 2:12)
- ✓ Strict training-(1 Cor 9:24)
- ✓ Train yourself to be godly-(1Tim 4:7)

2 Peter 1:8-For if you possess these qualities in increasing measures...

Peter is coaching Believers to NOT be ineffective and unproductive

- ✓ Often times making the team is not the same as suiting up, getting playing time or excelling-(Think the movie "Rudy")
- ✓ Practice perfects practice, (rather than "practice makes perfect" which it does not.)
- ✓ Building muscle and muscle memory creates a positive exercise dynamic

2 Peter 1:9-But if anyone does not have them, he is nearsighted and blind...

Peter strongly compares a non-achieving, no-effort Believer to a short sighted, no vision individual who has forgotten the value and importance of the possessed gift of great cost.

2 Peter 1:10-Therefore, brothers, be all the more **eager** to make your calling and election sure...

Peter instructs the Believer to actively exercise and develop abilities to confirm Jesus' decision to sacrifice His life for us.

- ✓ Be certain the Jesus would be pleased with your life, choices, thinking, behavior-always recognizing "when you can't, that He already has!"
- ✓ You can't be or get it perfect; the accumulation of these desirable abilities will develop a humility that reminds us the attempt, the intent, the engagement is rewarded because Jesus did all the work for us!

2 Peter 1:11-and you will receive a rich welcome into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Peter has first (maybe 2nd hand) awareness of this truth – (Acts 7:55-56, Acts 12:2) in addition to the 3 ½ years spent learning about this concept with Jesus

The tradition of Peter's crucifixion request partially illuminates this critical belief that he promotes in this letter then practices upon his execution.
